### Presidential Portfolio

### VP Academic Portfolio

<b>Class Liaison Director</b>	You work with one of your Class Liaisons to implement a change that has a lasting impact on students.
<b>Commerce Mentorship Program</b>	Hearing that students are struggling with COMM 293, a member of your executive team volunteers to hold office hours for students going through the course.
<b>ExCo</b>	A member of your executive team holds an informational interview with students to explain to them how the ExCo reimbursement process works and some of the international opportunities available to them.

### VP External Portfolio

### VP Marketing Portfolio

<b>Associate VP Marketing</b>	You take the initiative to redesign CUS templates or update the look of the CUS business cards.
